Your cooperation in preregistration for the Colloquium is urgently requested. It is essential in planning the Colloquium that we have an early estimate of the number of people who are coming. For this reason we are extending the preregistration cut off date indefinitely. If you have lost your form send in \$25.00 and forms will be sent to you. This fee covers everything (proceedings, banquet, cocktail party, etc.) except travel, room and board, and will be refunded should you be unable to attend.

#### HELPFUL HINTS TO ATTEND COLLOQUIUM, BY A. M. HEIMPEL

Please come to the Adult Education Building at the University of Maryland in College Park immediately upon arrival.

There are three airports servicing the College Park area: Dulles International, Friendship International at Baltimore, and Washington National. Whether coming from North America, Europe, or Asia, you should try to arrange for your flight to terminate at Friendship International Airport in Baltimore. The reason for this is that the limousine service from Friendship Airport makes its first stop at the Adult Education Building of the University of Maryland where the meeting is being held. Those arriving from foreign countries should have at least \$5 in U. S. money to pay for the limousine which costs \$3.50. Limited quantities of foreign currency can be changed at the Maryland National Bank in the terminal at Friendship Airport between the hours of 9 a.m. and 2 p.m.

The next best point of arrival would be Dulles International Airport. This airport is quite a distance out of town, however, it has a limousine service which will bring any traveler through Bethesda, Maryland, to Silver Spring, Maryland, where it stops first at the Georgian Motel and then finally at the Sheraton Hotel on Colesville Road. People attending the meeting who come to Dulles International Airport should take the limousine to the last stop at the Sheraton Hotel and should phone from there to the Adult Education Building and ask for the transportation desk of the Colloquium on Insect Pathology. The phone number is 454-2322. This is not a long distance call. Someone at our transportation desk will arrange your transfer from the Sheraton to the Adult Education Building. The cost of the limousine will be \$3.50 and

should all of these instructions fail we plan to have someone in the main terminal in front of the gates to aid our travelers. Please look for a large sign reading Colloquium on Insect Pathology. Incidentally, there is a foreign currency service at Dulles Airport located on the lower level of the terminal just past the bank.

We would not recommend that anybody use Washington National Airport. For one thing it is without a limousine service. Taxi service is available from the airport to the Greyhound Bus Terminal on 11th Street and New York Avenue where you can obtain a bus to College Park. If you choose this route you should get off anywhere convenient in College Park and phone the Adult Education Building at the previously mentioned number and ask for the Colloquium transportation desk. It is possible to get a taxi directly from Washington National Airport to College Park, however, the fare will be anywhere from 10 to 12 U. S. dollars. There is no foreign currency service at Washington National Airport but small amounts of funds can be exchanged at the Alexandria National Bank located on the second floor of the terminal.

From the 24th of August on through the meeting there will be a representative of the organizing committee at the Adult Education Building 24 hours a day. I will be on duty, personally, on the 24th so that you may phone the Adult Education Building and contact me there should you have any problems or troubles.

One thought that may aid you in planning your trip. Usually the first three weeks of August are extremely hot and humid, however, during the last week of August the weather may become more temperate and may even be slightly cool at night. As a consequence, I would recommend that you bring light summer clothing, but that you slip a sweater into your suitcase in case the weather follows its usual pattern. Normally, we have very little rain in this month and so I do not think that rainwear will be necessary unless you are supercautious. All of the facilities are air-conditioned, including the rooms at all locations where we are boarding our guests. I want you to realize that I am not issuing a guarantee of the weather, however, this is relatively a stable month as far as weather goes at College Park.

Come prepared to enjoy the meeting and to have a good time.
